About the Role

Our primary focus is serving children from birth through preschool age, while maintaining a smaller caseload of older children with medical and developmental complexities, siblings of current clients, and families living in more remote areas of Central Oregon.

Services are provided through a variety of settings, including:

- In-home visits
- Preschool and childcare settings
- Playhouse (clinic) visits
- Telehealth appointments, when appropriate

This is a full-time position offering the opportunity to make a meaningful impact in the lives of children and families throughout Central Oregon.

This position requires one day a week of travel to a remote location in Central Oregon.

What We're Looking For

- Occupational Therapy Assistant (OTA) licensed or eligible for licensure in Oregon
- Passion for working with infants, toddlers, preschoolers, and their families
- Strong communication and relationship-building skills
- Commitment to family-centered, strengths-based care
- Ability to work independently while collaborating closely with supervising occupational therapists and a multidisciplinary team
- Enthusiasm for community-based pediatric practice
- Experience working with children with developmental delays, sensory processing differences, feeding challenges, or medical complexities preferred, but not required
- Knowledge of child development, play-based intervention, sensory regulation, and pediatric occupational therapy principles preferred

Responsibilities

- Implement individualized treatment plans developed by supervising occupational therapists
- Provide engaging, play-based occupational therapy interventions that support developmental goals and meaningful participation in daily routines
- Support children in developing fine motor, visual motor, sensory processing, self-regulation, feeding, play, and activities of daily living skills
- Educate and coach caregivers on therapeutic activities, developmental strategies, sensory supports, and home programs
- Monitor client progress and communicate observations to supervising occupational therapists
- Assist with recommendations and implementation of adaptive equipment and environmental modifications as directed by the supervising occupational therapist
- Collaborate closely with caregivers, educators, healthcare providers, and community partners
- Deliver services across home, clinic, preschool, and telehealth settings as appropriate
- Maintain timely documentation in accordance with professional standards and organizational policies
- Participate in team meetings, care coordination, and collaborative treatment planning
- Contribute positively to a supportive, family-centered team culture
- Advocate for improved access to services for children and families
